A New Year, a New You. So goes the promise, every year, of making changes to your life, your health, your shape, your size, your weight, your finances, your living circumstances, your relationships, your time management, your _______ (fill in the blank), to improve your life and make you happier. The assumption is, of course, that something in your life needs to change to make you happy. How can you possibly be content living under the circumstances in which you currently reside? A New Year if the perfect time to fix that.

Now, certainly there are situations in all of our lives that could stand improvement and upon which we should act. If that were not the case, we would know we are in heaven. Nevertheless, the constant feeling that there is something in our lives that needs fixing or needs to be improved can lead to discontentment with lots of things, and sometimes with everything. When we learn, the hard way, that we cannot simply snap our fingers and change what we would like to have changed, or even try hard to change the things that need to be changed and we fail at it, one of our coping mechanisms is to place the blame on others; or to place the blame on our seemingly uncontrollable circumstances. Then, voila, discontentment with everything.

But rather than try to change everything around us, or hope that everything around us will change, perhaps we simply need to re-evaluate the way in which we evaluate things. Doing that is not easy either. In fact, St. Paul in the verse above, calls it a secret.

The reason Paul calls it a secret is that evaluating our situations accurately, appreciating every circumstances correctly, adjusting our attitude properly, is contrary to our sinful nature. That which God calls "good" our human nature thinks is challenging. That which God calls a "blessing" our sinful flesh rebels against as a threat. That which God says is meant to draw us closer to him, repulses our whole being, our sinful being, and makes us want to flee.

But Paul divulges the secret to being content in the very next verse. "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." That is, through faith in Christ Jesus, who made us his children for eternity and who promises to handle everything for our benefit in time, we can even adjust our attitude and be content in every circumstance.

So instead of: A New Year, A New You; how about: A New Year, A New Attitude. One of no finger pointing but of finger crossing in prayers of thankfulness and contentment for all that God has placed into our lives. That's the "secret" to a Happy New Year.

TRINITY LUTHERAN SCHOOL

This article begins by wishing you a Blessed New Year from the faculty, staff, and students of Trinity Lutheran School.

Many of you have heard of Smart Boards, an interactive whiteboard that is found in many of the classrooms at Trinity School. The current Smart Boards were introduced into the school in 2009 and because of daily usage, have not been functioning reliably. For that reason a request was made to the Endowment Fund Committee to fund the purchase of five Promethean Boards. These are the same boards that are being used at Martin Luther. Both faculties will be doing further training on these boards after January 1st so that they are better able to use them as an instructional tool in the classroom. Each board looks like a 70 inch TV and operates like a giant Android tablet. These boards allow the teacher to project an image on the screen directly from a computer or laptop. There is no need for a ceiling projector. Teachers can interact with the board through touch (A finger for writing and the palm of the hand for erasing) or use specialized pens The board can also remotely connect with the student's classroom chromebooks.

The new boards will bring Trinity Lutheran School into the next generation of classroom technology and will assist the teachers in enhancing classroom collaboration. We would like to again thank the Endowment Committee for approving the funds for this special purchase.

Financial Update

- ◆ Congregational support is 3.9% ahead of last November.
- By God's grace, the outpouring of \$1M in gifts has enabled FVL to secure low-interest tax-exempt bond funding to repay the Let the Children Come building debt. This means a payment of \$475K is due each October 1 for the next 20 years. The final payment is set for 2038. Donations to meet our October 2019 goal have already reached over \$25K! Please consider a gift to this effort.
- Need-based tuition assistance of \$299K was granted for this school year; gifts of \$100K are still needed to meet this amount.

TLS BLEACHER REPLACEMENT



The bleachers at Trinity Lutheran School have seated crowds for countless events since they were placed in the gymnasium long ago. In these seats, parents have watched as their children gave glory to God with their athletic abilities and their acting, and students and adults alike have listened to God's word preached at weekly chapel services. These bleachers have truly been a blessing, and we thank our God for leading the members of Trinity to give willingly to put them there.

However, with their lengthening age it has become clear that these bleachers need to be replaced as soon as possible. Newly installed bleachers will ensure the safety of our students and spectators. The design will add railings and handicap accessible areas. As an added bonus, the bleachers will also have more legroom and look great! But here is where we need your help:

The bleachers that we plan to install will have about 309 seats. The total cost of \$30,209 can be intimidating. Yet if the price is broken down, it will cost almost exactly \$100 per seat. Currently we have been gifted \$10,620 towards the cost of the new bleachers.
